The CrossGlobe Group is pleased to announce it will open its 5th facility in the Port of Virginia in late 2012. The board of the Virginia Port Authority approved funding to build a 500,000-square-foot warehouse where paper and pulp will be imported and exported. Construction of the new \$25 million warehouse is set to begin in the fall and to be completed in about a year.

The facility will be on dock at Portsmouth Marine Terminal, which is two and half hours from the open sea with (43) forty-three feet (13 meters) of draft and 3,540 feet of wharf.

Additionally it will have access to the rail networks of both Norfolk Southern Corp. and CSX Corp. Improvements to rail infrastructure on the property are included in the package.

Bill Franks, President and CEO of CrossGlobe stated, "This facility will be state of the art. With it's strategic location in the Port of Virginia it will give our customers improved supply chain options and is a continuation of our strategic plan which is to focus our growth on port based logistics operations."
